Regional Racing

Intro to Regional Racing

- The NCKC license allows you to participate in Regional Level Events (ex: Coupe de Montreal)
- More competitive, requires more travel and is more time consuming

Drivers are required to be comfortable at speed, in traffic, with starts, have experience with racecraft fundamentals and race/flag procedures. This is for their safety and the safety of others.

It was expressed by Zak that pushing drivers TOO far out of their comfort zone will not encourage learning. The opposite will happen and development will be hindered.

Regional Schedule

- Covered, All dates available on NCKC facebook as well as Coupe De Montreal website.
- Subject to change based on material shortages
- Unofficial practice days, a day early, mentioned by Zak

The Fees

- Staying the same, last year's increase for fuel and food allows this.
- No questions regarding Fees Value in Fees
 - Zak mentioned scales are available for members to borrow if they reach out

Registrations so far

• Roughly on target to be similar to last year (24 at the moment, more are completing, 27 last year)

Budget

- Budget Forecasted Revenue \$9,425.00
- Budget Forecasted Expenses \$10,306.65
- Expenses based on annual cost of food and fuel
- Banquet rose in cost 2021-2022 by 40%

Summary

• Down Expected \$881.65

Zak opened floor for ideas to recoup

- Lo: Idea of changing banquet location: School gym just as an example, school gyms rent for free
- John: 50/50 At banquet to help recoup cost
- Frank: Top Karting?
- Martin: Locations without a kitchen will require catering, Possibly bringing the total to the same.
- Lo, Frank: Shouldn't take away from drivers, Keep the transponder program going.
- Mike: at a location like top karting the event won't be a private banquet, going to make a few calls at a banquet hall.
- Zak: Could talk to current location to see if we could work it out

Worst case the club could take the hit as we do have some funds.

- Sylvain mentions we could save money on trophies for the banquet by reusing old trophies
